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**APPROVAL FOR ALLOCATION OF S106 FUNDS TO A PROJECT
ACTION UNDER DELEGATED AUTHORITY OF DIRECTOR OF FINANCE
(Cabinet Minute 8: 2016)**

PROJECT: Bass Hill Common – 10% contribution towards works funded by Heritage Lottery Funding.
The Friends of Wormley Open Spaces and The Borough of Broxbourne secured Heritage Lottery Funding of £66,800 which along with contributions from FOWOS and Broxbourne Council will make up the total project costs of £74,479.

The project concentrates on the re-creation of the historical link between 2 habitat rich areas which became separated in 1972 following the construction of the A10. The link between the two areas is a medieval sunken roadway which linked the River Lea to Broxbourne Woods and surrounding villages, with the old Roman Road network.

Interpretation panels will be installed to explain the history of the site. Ancient meadow, stream and woodland habitat will all be improved by coppicing, re-establishing the woodland ride, planting new glades. A boardwalk and steps will be installed improving ease of access. Bespoke notice boards will be added to both areas detailing events, activities and volunteering opportunities. A circular historical footpath and walk will be created.


The project will also include organised events such as bushcraft day, tree planting, family picnic days, wildlife related activities and guided walks.
